In order to base the program on the Long Term Athlete Development model (LTAD) and with the assistance of a certified national coach (National Coaching Certification Program, Level 3), CDSA will organize tournaments and clinics in collaboration with two Provincial Deaf Sports Associations (PDSA).

ADSA Badminton Tournament | April 14-15, 2018

Clinic with the national coach on April 14th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. followed by a friendly Badminton doubles tournament from 1:30 to 4:00 p.m. Finals will be on April 15th from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m.

Location: Alberta School for the Deaf in Edmonton, Alberta

Accommodation (2): Hotel and local transport are free. It is recommended to participants flying to Edmonton to arrive between 6:00 and 9:00pm to benefit from free local transport.

Registration: CDSA will cover the cost of registration for participants (\$20) from British Columbia, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Please **register online** with ADSA before March 31st, 2018. Note that the registration cost will be refunded to you onsite.

- (1) During clinics, the coach will divide participants in 2 groups (beginner and intermediate levels)
- (2) Some conditions apply. CDSA will offer accommodation for two nights and the registration cost for free to participants. Participants from the PDSAs (ASSQ in January and ADSA in April) will not benefit from this offer.
