## **Team Canada targets Gold at the World Ice Hockey Championships**

Montreal, April 5th, 2017 – The Canadian Deaf Sports Association (CDSA) fully support the Canadian Deaf Ice Hockey Federation (CDIHF) program and Our Pathway to the Gold Committee (OPTGC) that was established in preparation for the 3<sup>rd</sup> World Deaf Ice Hockey Championships to be held in Amherst, NY, USA from April 19th to 29th.

For the first time in the Deaf hockey history, two Women's team will play demo games. The United States and Canada will play two games on April 22nd and 23rd.

The Men's team is composed of a new generation of Deaf and hard of hearing players with an average age of 23 years. Canada won silver medals in the previous two World Championships in Vantaa, Finland (2003) and Winnipeg, Canada (2009). The goal for this year is to win Gold.

Thanks to the High Performance Sport Grant Program, the CDSA granted a substantial amount to the CDIHF and OPTGC to help them reach their goal.

Team Canada is surrounded by devoted individuals focused on its success, including Executive Director Roy Hysen and High Performance National coach Don McKee. The CDSA would like to highlight Steve Devine's exceptional contribution. Devine was promoted assistant to both the Executive Director and coach this year. He was an outstanding captain and leader of the team for over 12 years. Devine won one Gold medal and four silver medals at the World Championships and Winter Deaflympics.
