Jonathan Rose Wins Canadian Deaf Golf Championship Title It is Rose's 3rd title in the last five participations at this sport event

Montreal, August 10th, 2017 - The 13th Canadian Deaf Golf Championship was held at Le Diable Golf Course in Mont-Tremblant from July 25th to 27th. A total of 47 Deaf and Hard of Hearing golfers from five Canadian provinces competed on this course.

Jonathan Rose, Ont. and Alexandre Ouellet, Que. faced each other until the 18th hole for the title. Ouellet placed second and Rose won his third Canadian title. See results for the Elite category here.

At only 14 years old, Tylo Broszeit, Man. was the tournament's sensation as he placed 7th at his first participation at the Canadian Deaf Golf Championship.

In the Senior category, Jim Cranswick, BC won for the first time in his golf career. See results for the Senior category here.

In the Women's category, Marilyn Berrnink, Ont. went on to win a fifth title in her career (1999, 2005, 2007, 2011 and 2017).

The Canadian Deaf Golf Championship is important this year, because it is a qualification for the World Deaf Golf Championships to be held in July 2018 at the Carton House in Maynooth, Ireland
