The Organizing Committee (OC) proudly presents the 2018 Canada Deaf Games (CDG) that will be held in Winnipeg from February 17th to 24th, 2018. The Closing Ceremony will be on February 24th, 2018.

Sports: Curling | Men's & Women's Volleyball | Men's & Women's Ice Hockey | Men's Basketball | Snowboarding | Bowling

Objective: These competitions are a qualification for the **2019 Winter Deaflympics**. The Curling events will count as national tryouts. There will also be coaches and recruiters on site for Ice Hockey and Snowboarding.

The Basketball games will help select the best players U21 (21 years old and under) for the **U21 World Basketball Championships** at Gallaudet University, Washington, U.S. in July 2018.

Registration: We encourage participants to communicate with their respective Provincial Deaf Sports Association (PDSO) during the Registration period from May 26th to October 31st, 2017. Please consult Annexe A for the PDSOs contact information. Participants might be assigned to an interprovincial team.

Accommodation / Local Transport: Note that bookings must be made by the PDSOs. Two double sized beds at the Canad Inn Polo Park are \$135 per night plus tax. When making a reservation for this hotel, please mention that you are an athlete or coach at the 2018 CDG. Local transport will be provided by the OC only for Snowboarding events. Basic Rules



Team selections are based on the PDSOs' selection process. If there are individuals available for an interprovincial team, please ensure they have minimal skills. Technical rules for each sport

General Rules for each Sport

Volleyball

- Volleyball Canada rules will be applied:
- Women's and Men's Volleyball will be 6 vs 6; and *1
- Women's and Men's Volleyball 4 vs 4 will become Co-Ed only if the number of registrations is low; and
- Change of formula for Women's and Men's Volleyball 6 vs 6. *2
- *1 The formula will be applied if we receive a good number of registrations.
- *2 The 2018 CDG OC will make an announcement on the formula (6 vs 6 or Co-Ed 4 vs 4) after the Early Registration date.

Bowling

- No restriction or limit of players;
- Games will be conducted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the WTBA; and
- For more information consult the Technical Rules.

Men's Basketball 3 vs 3

- The 5 on 5 rule is in accordance with rules used in high school and/or college leagues;
- There is a maximum of 5 faults. If you get 5 faults you will sit out for the rest of the game;
- Travel will be considered a fault if you have stepped more than 2 steps before you throw the basketball;
- Double will be considered a fault if you start to dribble with both hands;
- Shot clock means you have 24 or 30 seconds to score, otherwise you will have a turnover. Please be advised that turnovers occur in a full court;
- Eight (8 seconds) to get out of the half court, get into the other half then back into the initial half. This is the turnover procedure;
- You can use half court for a maximum of 30 seconds to score, and up to 11 or 21 points to win; and

Ice Hockey

- Men's Hockey. Women's Hockey is added;
- Hockey Canada rules will be applied:
- A team should be composed of 10 or less skaters and one (1) goalie;
- Each team should start the game with a minimum of six (6) players: five (5) skaters and one (1) goalie;
- Each team will play with four (4) players on the ice, including one (1) goalie and three (3) players;
- All games will be NON-BODYCHECKING;
- All games will have two (2) periods, and each period will last 22 minutes of continuous play; and
- For more information consult the Technical Rules.

Curling

- Women's and Men's Curling; and
- Curling Canada rules will be applied.
- For more information consult the Technical Rules.

Snowboarding

- Two (2) events: Big Air and Slopestyle;
- These events will be held at Holiday Mountain;
- Athletes must be aged 15 years old by December 31st, 2017; and
- For more information consult the Technical Rules.
