Montreal, September 22nd, 2017 - The Canadian Deaf Sports Association (CDSA) is selected by the International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (ICSD) to organize and host the 4th World Deaf Ice Hockey Championship to be held from April 7th to 17th, 2021.

Vancouver will be the host city for the event. British Columbia's largest city is not stranger to international events as the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games were held in this city.

"In collaboration with the Vancouver Organizing Committee, CDSA will support the organization of the event to ensure a total success. It also aligns with one of CDSA's Strategic Directions from the Strategic Plan 2017-2022: Maximize awareness of CDSA at the national and international levels when hosting sport events in Canada (glowing)," said Alain Turpin, CDSA Executive Director.
