



Canada wishes to repeat 2002 feat at the World Deaf Golf Championship
One hundred fifteen golfers from 19 countries will reunite in Dublin

Montreal, July 20, 2018 - The 12th World Deaf Golf Championship will be held from July 21st to 28th in Dublin, Ireland. A total of 115 Deaf golfers from 19 countries will compete in the Men's, Men's Senior and Women's events.

The Canadian delegation is formed of 11 golfers that will be accompanied by coach Stan Smith (ON). In 2002 also in Dublin, Canadian golfers won a first World title by winning the team event. The team event accumulates the best four scores during four days.

Jonathan Rose (Ont.), Alexandre Ouellet (Que.), Ryan Mobberley (Man.), Dale Proctor (BC) and Sheldon Dueck (Man.) will try to repeat the feat by winning the team event while Jim Cranswick (BC), Michael Parkes (BC), Denis Marchand (Que.) and Paul Landry (BC) will compete in the Men's Senior event.

Sasha Laoun (Que.) and Janette Lyon (Ont.) will represent the Maple Leaf in the Women's event.

"With only a few days before the event, Team Canada is ready! We are proud to represent Canada in Dublin and we have good chances to stand out," said Team Canada manager, Dana McCarthy.
