RE: Confirming the dates for the Canadian Curling Championship in Morris, Manitoba

Dear PDSA Members,

1) 4th World Deaf Curling Championship in Banff in 2022 (2022 WDCC)

For those who may not yet know, the International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (ICSD), the Canadian Deaf Sports Association (CDSA), and the event's organizing committee at the Alberta Deaf Sports Association (ADSA) have recently announced the official dates for the 2022 World Deaf Curling Championship in Banff, Alberta, namely, March 12 to 26, 2022. Three official events will be held at the 2022 WDCC ([read the ICSD's announcement](#)).

2) Canadian Curling Championship

The CDSA and the Morris Curling Club—Cargill Curling Training Centre (MCC-CCTC) in Morris, Manitoba have reserved November 10 to 14, 2021 as the dates for the Canadian Curling Championship.

Three events will be held at the Championship: Women's Curling; Men's Curling; and Mixed Doubles Curling. In accordance with CDSA practice, the champions from these events will represent Team Canada at 2022 WDCC.

Registration rules, a draft timetable, and details regarding accommodations and local transportation options will be sent to the PDSAs and posted on the CDSA's social media pages no later than April 30.

3) Health measures

While the situation regarding the pandemic has improved somewhat, the CDSA will closely monitor conditions in conjunction with provincial and federal government and public health authorities to determine whether to hold or cancel the event. We remain hopeful that inter-provincial air-travel restrictions will be lifted by autumn 2021.
