She is one of the best swimmers in the Canadian Deaf sports history. She competed in two Summer Deaflympics and won nine medals by participating in 10 events. This amounts to six gold medals, two silver medals and one bronze medal.

Ms. Robinson was also the first woman to be President of the CDSA Board of Directors from 1984 to 1986.
